Students are enthusiastically invited to take part in the ARCTIC FESTIVAL by showcasing their own work in the following contests. Participation is strictly voluntary.

Winning entries will be posted (with permission) on the 90-NORTH OUTREACH EDUCATION Facebook page - with child's name and age.

*** ARCTIC POSTER CONTEST ***

Art posters will be judged based on their originality, creativity, artistic merit and expression of theme.

Artwork may be a drawing (black-&-white or color), painting or collage. Submissions must be an original work of art created by the student. Computer-generated graphics should NOT be used. Stiff paper is preferred (poster board, construction paper, card-stock, foam-core, etc.) and should not exceed 18"X24" in size regardless of orientation. Posters will be displayed and judged by age group. Student's name should appear ONLY on the back of the poster!

Students 6-9: Show off your favorite Arctic animal (Polar Bear, Beluga Whale, Arctic Fox, Narwhal, Harp Seal, Muskox, Reindeer, Arctic birds, etc.).

Students 10-12: Show off your preferred Arctic interest. Examples: icebergs, the northern lights, map of the Arctic Region, polar explorers, etc.

Students 13+: Create an infographic or powerful statement image that would illustrate how and why we should "PROTECT THE ARCTIC." Feel free to create your own slogan! For ideas and inspiration, visit this website: https://www.savethearctic.org/en/iceedge/poster-contest/

*** ARCTIC STE(A)M PROJECT ***

Projects should relate to the Arctic and include at least one of the STEM acronym themes: Science (includes zoology, meteorology, physics, etc.), Technology, Engineering, Mathematics. Submissions may be 3-panel boards or 3-dimensional dioramas, and should be created solely by the student. Projects will be displayed and judged by age group. Student's name should appear ONLY on the back of the project!

Students 6-9: Create your own comparison chart. [Some suggestions: Human hand print to Polar Bear paw print in the snow. Size of Narwhal compared to a Humpback Whale. Area of Greenland superimposed over the continental USA. Size of Polar Bear claw to Grizzly Bear claw.]

Students 10-12: Create your own Arctic diagram. [Some suggestions: Show the different colors of the aurora (northern lights) and what creates each one. Show how much of an iceberg appears above and below the water's surface. Show all of the different shapes of icebergs.]

Students 13+: Create an Arctic-themed infographic. [Some suggestions: Snow reflectivity = albedo effect. Show the migration route of the Arctic Tern. Depict the Arctic Tundra biome. Show polar atmospheric phenomena such as Fata Morgana mirages or ice halos.]
